The Get Weird Tour The tour began on 13 March 2016 in Cardiff, Wales and concluded on 27 August 2016 in Newmarket, England. On 17 July 2015, the group The Get Weird Tour was the third concert tour and the first worldwide tour held by British girl group Little Mix, in support of their third studio album, *Get Weird*, announced in July 2015. It was recorded at Abbey Road Studios between 7 April and 17 June 1966 and evolved considerably between the first takes and the final version released on album. The song seems to have been hard to arrange until the soul-style horns, strongly reminiscent of the Stax's Memphis soul and Motown sound, were... The Get Weird Tour received positive reviews. It also marked the first time that the group had performed to audiences across Europe, Oceania and Asia. The tour consisted of 60 sold out shows, selling over 411,421 tickets worldwide, and grossed over \$25.7 million. In March 2016, Little Mix was awarded a plaque to commemorate them having the highest selling UK arena tour of 2016 at that time, selling over 300,000 tickets in the UK alone. In

terms of its popularity, the song is the most recognizable one from *Funny Lady*.
