The integrity of the perception and its order are achieved through the following principles of Gestalt psychology: Closeness Gestalt qualities (German: Gestaltqualitäten) are concepts found in gestalt psychology which refer to the essential nature of a perceptual experience. Gestalt qualities were introduced by the Austrian philosopher Christian von Ehrenfels in his essay "On Gestalt Qualities," published in 1890. The quality “trans – positivity” is manifested in the fact that the image of the whole remains even if all the parts change. An example would be how a melody is perceived, as a whole, rather than merely the sum of its individual notes. This discovery later led to the famous. Visual hierarchy Visual hierarchy, according to Gestalt psychology, is a pattern in the visual field wherein some elements tend to "stand out," or attract attention, more strongly than other elements, suggesting a hierarchy of importance. While it may occur naturally in any visual field, the term is most commonly used in design (especially graphic design and cartography), where elements are intentionally designed to make some look more important than others.
