End-to-end auditable voting While measures such as voter verified paper audit trails and manual recounts measure the effectiveness End-to-end auditable or end-to-end voter verifiable (E2E) systems are voting systems with stringent integrity properties and strong tamper resistance. E2E systems use cryptographic techniques to provide voters with receipts that allow them to verify their votes were counted as cast, without revealing which candidates a voter supported to an external party. which may be difficult and introduces many points of failure. As such, these systems are sometimes called receipt-based systems df44135361
