The pH scale is logarithmic and inversely indicates the activity of hydrogen cations in the solution. More than two million tons of citric acid are manufactured every year. It is used widely as acidifier, flavoring, preservative, and chelating agent. H^+ pH = A citrate is a derivative of citric acid; that is, the salts, esters, and the polyatomic anion found in solutions and salts of citric acid. An example of the former, a salt is trisodium citrate; an ester is triethyl citrate. When citrate trianion is part of a salt, the formula of the citrate trianion is written as $\text{C}_6\text{H}_5\text{O}_3^{3-}$ or $\text{C}_3\text{H}_5\text{O}(\text{COO})_3^{3-}$.

pH the pH of a solution containing acids or bases, a chemical speciation calculation is used to determine the concentration of all chemical species present In chemistry, pH (pee-AYCH) is a logarithmic scale used to specify the acidity or basicity of aqueous solutions. Acidic solutions (solutions with higher concentrations of hydrogen (H⁺) cations) are measured to have lower pH values than basic or alkaline solutions. Ethylene oxide is an organic compound with the formula C₂H₄O. e. It is a cyclic ether and the simplest epoxide: a three-membered ring consisting of one oxygen atom and two carbon atoms. Ethylene oxide is isomeric with acetaldehyde and with vinyl alcohol. Because it is a strained ring, ethylene oxide easily participates in a number of addition reactions that result in ring-opening. Ethylene oxide is industrially produced by oxidation of ethylene in the presence of a silver catalyst 4017424dc6

Ammonium chloride It is a product of the reaction of hydrochloric acid and ammonia. It is also found around some types of volcanic vents. It is a white crystalline salt that is highly soluble in water. In its naturally occurring mineralogical form, it is known as sal ammoniac. It is an ammonium salt of hydrogen chloride. It is mainly used as fertilizer and a flavouring agent in some types of liquorice. The mineral is commonly formed on burning coal dumps from condensation of coal-derived gases. Solutions of ammonium chloride are mildly acidic. It consists of ammonium cations [NH₄]⁺ and chloride anions Cl⁻. Nutrient-rich solutions can promote the growth of microorganisms over time, so that microbial activity can alter the chemical composition of the solution, potentially. Tartaric acid Tartaric acid has been known to winemakers for centuries. Tartaric acid, an alpha-hydroxy-carboxylic acid, is diprotic and aldaric in acid characteristics and is a dihydroxyl derivative of succinic acid. However, the chemical process for extraction was developed in 1769 by the Swedish chemist Carl Wilhelm. Tartaric acid is a white, crystalline organic acid that occurs naturally in many fruits, most notably in grapes but also in tamarinds, bananas, avocados, and citrus. The acid itself is added to foods as an antioxidant E334 and to impart its distinctive sour taste. Naturally occurring tartaric acid is a useful raw material in organic synthesis. Potassium bitartrate is commonly mixed with sodium bicarbonate and is sold as baking powder used as a leavening agent in food preparation. Its salt, potassium bitartrate, commonly known as cream of tartar, develops naturally in the process of fermentation 4017424dc6
