The incident is the second deadliest school shooting in US history behind the Virginia Tech shooting in 2007. Earlier that day, before driving to the school, Lanza fatally shot his mother at their Newtown home. As first responders arrived at the school, Lanza killed himself with a gunshot to the head. As opposed to permanent ablation, the effect can be reversed by turning off the DBS device. Common targets include the globus pallidus, ventral nuclear group of the thalamus, internal capsule, and subthalamic nucleus.
