Performance on indirect tests may reflect contributions of implicit memory, the effects of priming, a preference to respond to previously experienced stimuli over novel stimuli

Experiential measures can be used as a proxy for language dominance in bilingual language acquisition research. According to Annick De Houwer, in an article in The Handbook of Child Language, simultaneous bilingualism takes place in "children who are regularly addressed in two spoken languages from before the age of two and who continue to be regularly addressed in those languages up until the final stages" of language development. This is in contrast to sequential bilingualism, in which the second language is learned not as a native language but a foreign language addcc3a9f3
