Prime number A natural number (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 A prime number (or a prime) is a natural number greater than 1 that is not a product of two smaller natural numbers. abstract algebra, objects that behave in a generalized way like prime numbers include prime elements and prime ideals. For example, 5 is prime because the only ways of writing it as a product, 1×5 or 5×1 , involve 5 itself. However, 4 is composite because it is a product (2×2) in which both numbers are smaller than 4. A natural number greater than 1 that is not prime is called a composite number. Primes are central in number theory because of the fundamental theorem of arithmetic: every natural number greater than 1 is either a prime itself or can be factorized as a product of primes that is unique up to their order

Examples of the most studied classes of algebraic varieties are lines, circles, parabolas, ellipses, hyperbolas, cubic curves like elliptic curves, and quartic curves like lemniscates and Cassini ovals.
